

## Summary of Studies of Religion II HSC examination specifications and assessment requirements from 2010

In December 2008, the Board of Studies approved changes to the examination specifications and assessment requirements for a number of courses. These changes will be implemented for the 2010 HSC cohort. The HSC examination specifications and assessment requirements for Studies of Religion II are outlined below.

### Outline of HSC examination specifications

A written examination of three hours plus 5 minutes reading time.

<p><i>Section I – Religion and Belief Systems in Australia post-1945, and Religion and Non-Religion</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Objective response questions</li> <li>Two short-answer questions</li> </ul>	<p>20</p> <p>10</p>

<p><i>Section III – Religious Tradition Depth Study</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Five extended response questions, each from a different religious tradition.</li> <li>Students answer one question, on a different religious tradition from those chosen in Section II, with an expected length of response of around six examination writing booklet pages (approximately 800 words).</li> </ul>	<p>20</p>
<p><i>Section IV – Religion and Peace</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>One extended response question with an expected length of response of around six examination writing booklet pages (approximately 800 words).</li> </ul>	<p>20</p>

### Changes from current examination specifications

In Section II, the constraint that 'no part is worth more than 6 marks' has been removed.

In Sections III and IV the expected length for the responses is included as a guide. It is presented as the approximate number of examination writing booklet pages (based on average-sized handwriting), and/or an approximate number of words. Students will not be penalised for responses of excess length: they may write less than or more than what is expected, and their responses will be marked on their merits.

### Outline of internal assessment requirements

There will be three to five assessment tasks comprising the following components and weightings.

Communication of information, ideas and issues in appropriate forms	20
